ENTRANCE AND MAINTENANCE REQUIREMENTS FOR THE MISSISSIPPI COLLEGE TEACHER EDUCATION PROGRAM (TEP) – Secondary and K-12

Teacher candidates will apply for admission into the Teacher Education Program (TEP) as part of the course requirements for EDU 300, INTRODUCTION TO EDUCATION. Transfer students who have had the course equivalent of EDU 300 at another 4-year institution, must make application to TEP in the Office of Field Experiences (Lowrey 207) during their first semester at Mississippi College. No upper level (300-400) courses including EDU 300 are accepted in transfer from 2-year colleges as part of Teacher Education Program requirements. All students must be admitted to the TEP before taking any courses for which TEP admission is required. All teacher candidates applying for entrance into the TEP must:

Additionally the student must:

1. have successfully completed 44 semester hours
2. have an overall (cumulative) GPA of at least 2.75
3. have a minimum GPA of 2.75 in the area(s) of expected certification
4. pass the PRAXIS I Core CASE: Reading 156; Writing 162; Mathematics 150. *Entrance test is waived if student has a high school ACT score of 21 or higher (no sub-test below 18) or SAT (990 or higher math/verbal).*
5. have passed the Writing Proficiency Exam or ENG 299.

ENTRANCE AND MAINTENANCE REQUIREMENTS FOR THE PROFESSIONAL SEMESTER (PS) of STUDENT TEACHING AT MISSISSIPPI COLLEGE

STUDENT TEACHING ASSIGNMENTS ARE RESTRICTED TO COPIAH, HINDS, LINCOLN, MADISON, RANKIN, WARREN, AND YAZOO COUNTIES.

Appeals to student teach outside of these areas must be made to the Teacher Education Department Chair. Student Teaching is to be completed during the senior year after the following requirements have been met:

1. be admitted to the Teacher Education Program for at least one full semester prior to the semester of student teaching.
2. have completed EDU 299.
3. have passed the Writing Proficiency Exam.
4. not have any grades of (I) incomplete.
5. complete any correspondence courses and have grade(s) on file in the Registrar's Office before the Professional Semester begins.
6. have at least a 2.75 GPA in the area(s) of expected certification as well as a cumulative GPA of 2.75.
7. have completed at least three-fourths of the required courses in his/her area of specialization, (secondary education students only).
8. have completed (with a minimum grade of C) all Professional Education and subject matter courses except 471, 472, 473, 474 (K-12 students only) and EDU 431, 432, 433, 434 (7-12 students).
9. upon taking EDU 460 must pass with a grade of C or better.
10. have completed one Personal Fitness Assessment and reported results to Physical Education College Advisor.
11. have discussed Physical Educator's Code of Conduct with Advisor and signed contract agreeing to abide by Code throughout Student Teaching.

It is the responsibility of each teacher candidate to return a completed application for student teaching to the Office of Field Experiences by the assigned date.

Teacher candidates pass the Praxis I as part of the entrance requirements into the TEP. Teacher candidates also pass the Praxis II which includes the Principles of Learning and Teaching (PLT) plus a specialty area test in order to be licensed by the Mississippi Department of Education.
