MASTER OF EDUCATION (M.ED.) ADMISSION, MAINTENANCE AND GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Must have a Class A Certificate issued by a state department of education, or must have completed a teacher education program accredited by NCATE. (Applies to all programs except school counseling and teaching arts.) (A photocopy of the standard educator license is required.)
- 2. Must have at least twelve semester hours of undergraduate courses in education and psychology. (Requirement waived for teaching arts program applicants.)
- 3. Must have minimum of eighteen hours of undergraduate courses in the teaching field in which the graduate degree will be pursued. For the English teaching field, the total of 18 hours must be composed of courses beyond the core curriculum of literature surveys and freshman composition courses.
- 4. Must have a composite score of 1000 or better on the pre-1983 NTE or have met the State minimum scores on the three sections of the NTE Core Battery (Communication Skills 651; General Knowledge 646; Professional Knowledge 649) or PPST (Reading 172; PPST Writing 173; PPST Math 172 (as of September 1, 2012).
- 5. Must have met or surpassed the State minimum score of 530 on the Praxis II ENGLISH Specialty Test.
- 6. Must maintain a 3.0 quality point average.
- 7. At least 50% of course in program must be taken at the 6000 level.
- 8. No degree requirement may be waived without the approval of the Graduate Dean.
 - Make application for graduation with the Registrar's Office. (The diploma is ordered from this information)
 - Apply for Oral-Written Comprehensive Examination with the Graduate Office.

At the END of the last semester, fill out a transcript request form and application for licensure which will be sent to the Department of Education. (These forms are available in the Teacher Education Office in Lowrey Hall.) You are responsible for gathering together the required information and sending it to the Mississippi Department of Education.
