Local Educators Participate in Advanced Placement Reading

DAYTONA BEACH, FLORIDA: *Steven Price and David Miller (Department of English)* participated June 2002 in the annual reading and scoring of the College Board's AP[®] Examinations in English Literature.

Each year the AP[®] Program, sponsored by the College Board, gives hundreds of thousands of capable high school students an opportunity to take rigorous college-level courses and examinations and, based on their exam performance, to receive credit and/or advanced placement when they enter college.

Almost 1.6 million examinations in 18 disciplines were evaluated by over 6,000 faculty consultants from high schools and universities across North America. Drawn from various ethnic groups and from every state, these men and women are some of the best high school and college educators in the United States and Canada. They represent some of the finest academic institutions in North America. In addition, we have faculty consultants from the Virgin Islands, Guam, Brazil, Belgium, Costa Rica, Egypt, El Salvador, Germany, Guatemala, Ireland, Jamaica, Japan, Mexico, Micronesia, New Zealand, South Korea, Spain, Turkey, United Arab Emirates, the United Kingdom, and the West Indies.

New Mississippi College President, Lee Royce, Delivers August Commencement Address

CLINTON Summer Commencement ceremonies Closing the 176th academic session at Mississippi College were held Saturday, August 3 at 10 a.m. in A. E. Wood Coliseum on the Clinton campus. Degrees were conferred by Mississippi College President Lee G. Royce on approximately 130 graduates.

Royce's address entitled, *The Power of Faith*, examined the powerful concept of faith as the motive power for all worthy action in life. In his remarks, Royce said, "Faith is trust in, reliance upon, and confidence in something or someone else. Faith is common to all human experience. Faith is necessary to know anything of any value about other persons and about the Supreme Person. And in his final charge, Royce said, "I supremely hope you continue to grow in faith in God, in your reliance upon the Lord Jesus Christ, in your confidence in what God can do in you and wants to do through you. May you grow in faith and in so doing find reason upon reason to believe in

yourself, your country, and the goodness, love and generosity of God to experience what He so much wants to give to each of us."

The Rev. Joe Barron, Senior Pastor, Northrich Baptist Church, Richardson, Texas, brought to Invocation. Giving the Benediction was Dr. Keith Gordon, Consultant, Pastor Leadership Development of the Mississippi Baptist Convention Board in Jackson, MS.
