Fall 2003 Community Service Center Hours Report

1,901 Total Volunteer Hours

Out of those hours, 8 hours were done for disciplinary/probation reasons, 1,845.5 hours were Service Learning, and 47.5 hours were done for other reasons.

Out of the 1,901 total volunteer hours 184.5 hours were done through MC Friends, 182 hours were done through the Baptist Children's Village, 129.5 hours were done through Habitat for Humanity, 124 hours were done through Wisecare Christian Daycare. The rest of the hours were done through various other organizations.

A total of 203 students participated with the Community Service Center.

We held a Service Fair early on in the semester to get students interested in volunteering and a chance to meet up with some of the agencies.

Our big project for this semester was Angel Tree.

Spring 2004 Community Service Center Hours Report

1,374.35 Total Volunteer Hours

Out of those hours, 48 hours were done for disciplinary/probation reasons, 1,302.60 were Service Learning, and 23.75 were done for other reasons.

Out of the 1,374.35 total volunteer hours 71.3 hours were done through Wisecare Christian Daycare, 133.75 were done through MC Friends, 154 hours were done through Habitat for Humanity, and 59 hours were done through the Baptist Children's Village.

We held a Service Fair early on in the semester to get students interested in volunteering and a chance to meet up with some of the agencies.

We did not host a semester project.

Some goals for next year would be better publicity of things going on in the Center, find ways to get more students involved, hosting a big service project each semester, and working better and harder with the teachers to make this easier and more enjoyable for all who participate.
