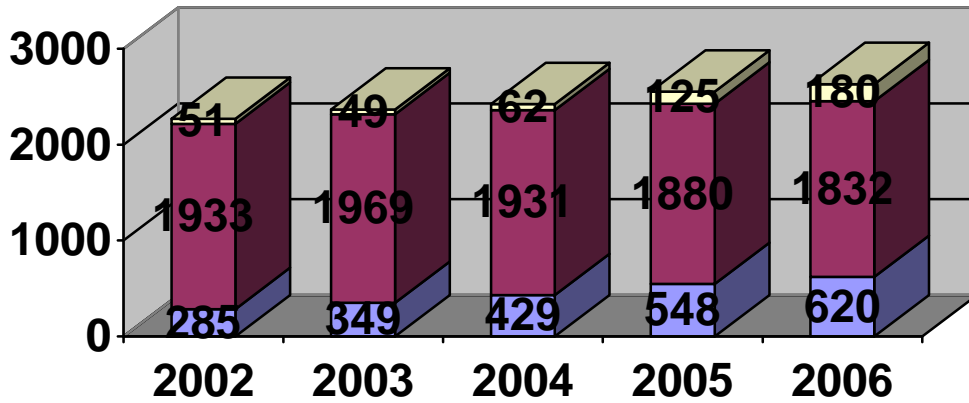

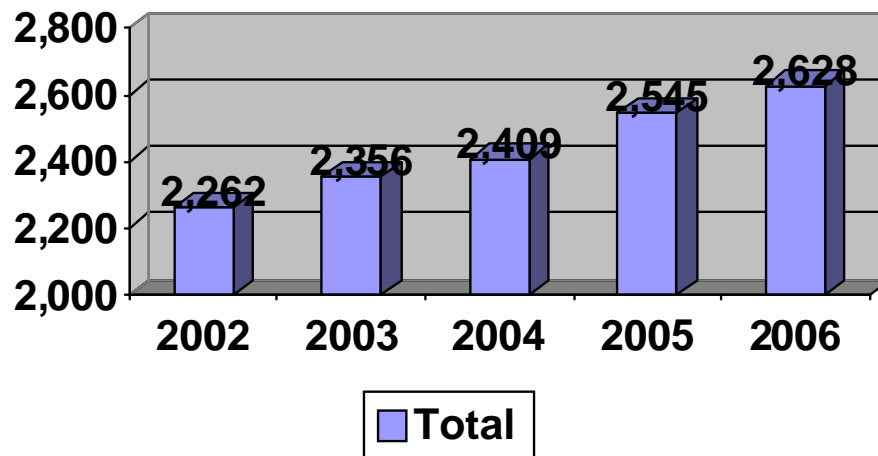
## UNDERGRADUATE ENROLLMENT BY ETHNICITY

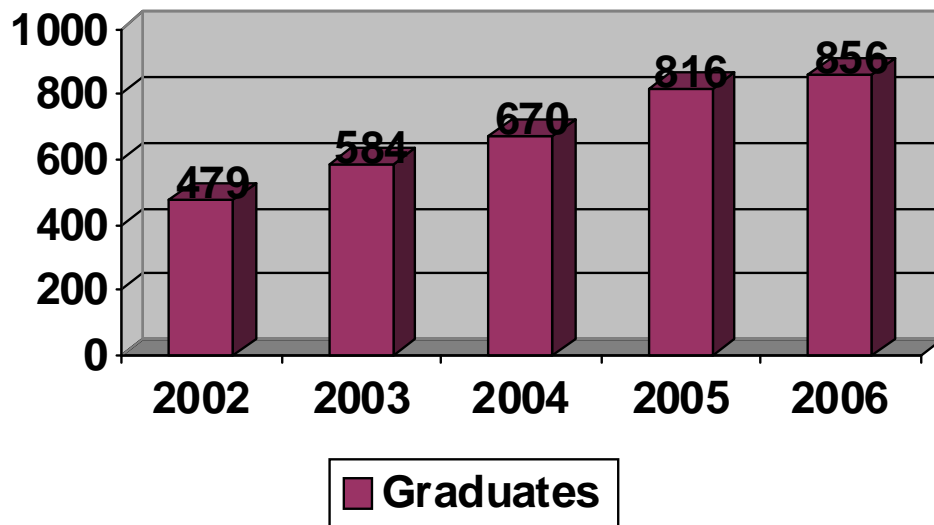

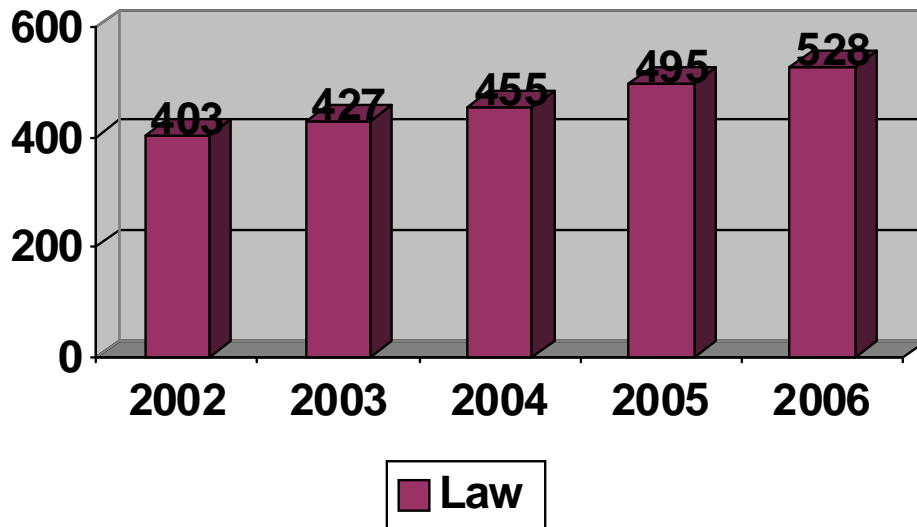
**DEGREE SEEKING GRADUATES**

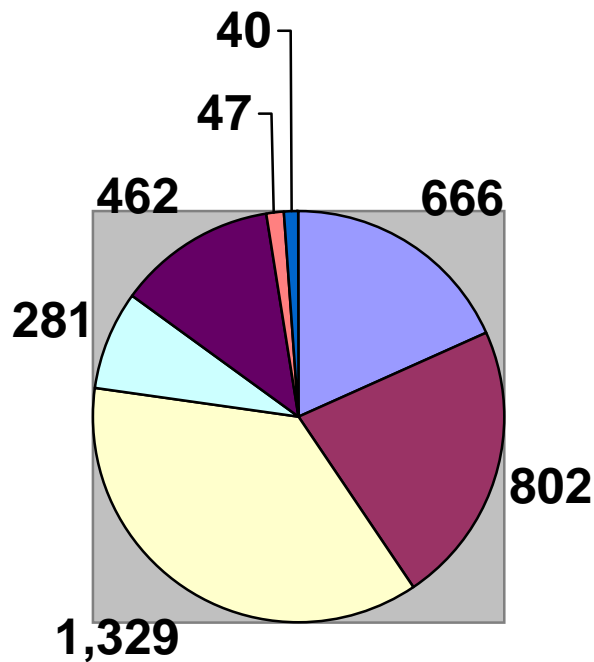
