INTRODUCTION

Mississippi College is committed to encouraging students to utilize their skills, talents, and abilities to serve the church and the community. The Community Service Center was established at Mississippi College to enhance and promote a greater awareness of and involvement in service to the needs of the local area. The MCCSC increasingly serves as the coordinator and facilitator of service projects for campus organizations as well as for individual students, faculty, and staff members.

PERSONNEL CHANGES AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS DURING THE YEAR

- A. *Personnel Changes.* In October Charlie Floyd was placed as an Americorps volunteer and given the charge through a grant received to recruit more volunteers for community service activities. Ethan and Emily Jones were given charge over the newly created "Think Together Tutoring Center."

ORGANIZATIONAL MODIFICATIONS

Student positions were changed as Shari sought to connect with agencies and provide more opportunities for students. A new program guided by MC was developed in the Hunter Oaks Apartment complex.

GOALS/OBJECTIVES AND/OR SIGNIFICANT ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF THE UNIT

1. Fall 2006 – A service fair was held early in the semester to get students interested in volunteering and also to provide an opportunity for interaction between the agencies and students. The largest project undertaken by the MCCSC was Angel Tree. Due to computer problems individual and semester volunteer hours were lost.
2. September – Think Together Tutoring Center was successfully launched reaching 140 underserved students.
3. Spring 2007 – A Service Fair was held during the early part of the semester to increase awareness and connect the students with various agencies and their representatives.
4. Over 38,000 hours of community service were recorded for the year.

GOALS/OBJECTIVES OF THE UNIT FOR 2007-2008

1. The Community Service Center will connect community organizations needing assistance with students, faculty, and staff wishing to perform community service.
2. The Community Service Center will encourage service-learning projects in academic courses.
3. The Community Service Center will encourage awareness among the campus community of the service it offers to students, faculty, and staff.

ASSESSMENT FOR INSTITUTIONAL EFFECTIVENESS

The following were changed to improve the MCCSC effectiveness in meeting the needs of students and the community:

1. Student positions were shifted
2. Americorps Volunteer was utilized
3. Tutoring center was established.
