The Community Service Center was established at Mississippi College to enhance and promote a greater awareness of and involvement in service to the needs of the local area. The MCCSC increasingly serves as the coordinator and facilitator of service projects for campus organizations as well as for individual students, faculty, and staff members.

In keeping with the Mission Statement of Mississippi College, we seek to "promote the spiritual, social, emotional, and physical development of its students and encourages them to utilize their skills, talents, and abilities as they pursue meaningful careers, life-long learning, and service to God and others.
