ADMISSION, MAINTENANCE AND GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

In order to be admitted into the M.Ed. in Special Education program, the following criteria must be met:
1 Must have an undergraduate degree in Elementary, Secondary or K-12 Education.
2 Must hold a current Class A Teacher/Educator License issued by a State Department of
Education or be eligible for a reciprocal MS Educator License. (A photocopy of the standard educator license is required.)
3 Must have at least twelve semester hours of undergraduate courses in education and/or psychology.
The requirement for remaining in academic good standing as a graduate student at Mississippi College is the same as the requirement for graduation – a cumulative GPA of 3.00 or higher on all grade point hours applied to the graduate major at Mississippi College. A student whose GPA is less than 3.00 will be notified.
Successful completion of the M.Ed. is Special Education degree requires that the following criteria be met:
1 Take and pass a comprehensive examination based upon required coursework and field
experiences. If judged unsatisfactory, all or part of the examination may be retaken once in the following semester
or term. Students with a cumulative, overall GPA of 3.75 or higher may be exempt from this exam. 2 Satisfactorily completed all courses within the degree program.
No degree requirement may be waived without the approval of the Graduate Dean.

The information will be reported to the Dean, thereafter.
