Online Instruction and Design Certificate

Schools and Districts can no longer rely solely on traditional instruction utilizing a face-to-face model; instead, educators must become versed in online instructional delivery and design to meet current needs of K-12 learners. The Online Instruction K-12 certification program is designed for students who are seeking training and preparation in developing, teaching, managing, and assessing effective online instruction in today's K-12 schools by studying learning theories, instructional strategies, technology, and best practices for application in the virtual classroom.

This certificate program consists of four 7-week courses, with Spring, Summer, and Fall start date possibilities. Limited full tuition assistance available.

Admission, Maintenance, and Graduation Requirements

- Must have completed a teacher education program from an accredited university and/or must have earned a Class A standard, educator license issued by a state department of education or a recognized state agency (a photocopy of the standard, educator license required).
- Must have at least twelve semester hours of undergraduate courses in education and psychology.
- Must have met or surpassed the acceptable score for Mississippi on the Praxis II Specialty Test or appropriate state licensing tests where teaching license was issued.
- Must maintain a 3.0 quality point average
- No degree requirement may be waived without the approval of the Graduate Dean.
