ENTRANCE AND MAINTENANCE REQUIREMENTS FOR THE MISSISSIPPI COLLEGE TEACHER EDUCATION PROGRAM (TEP)

Students will apply for admission into the Teacher Education Program (TEP) as part of the course requirements for EDU 300, INTRODUCTION TO EDUCATION. Transfer students, who have had the course equivalent of EDU 300 at another 4-year institution, must make application to the TEP by seeing the licensure secretary in the School of Education during their first semester at Mississippi College. No upper level (300-400) courses including EDU 300 are accepted in transfer from 2-year colleges as part of Teacher Education program requirements. All students applying for entrance into the TEP are given one calendar year from the time of their first testing to pass the Praxis I (if required) and to achieve a cumulative GPA of 2.50 or above. Additionally, the student must:

- Have successfully completed 44 semester hours of core
 Have an overall (cumulative) GPA of at least 2.75
 Have a minimum GPA of 2.75 in the area(s) of expected certification
 Pass the PRAXIS- Core Academic Skills for Educators (CASE): Reading 156; Writing 162; Mathematics 150.
 Entrance test is waived if student has a high school ACT/21 or higher (no sub-test below 18) or SAT (860 or higher math/verbal).
- 5. Have passed the writing proficiency test/or ENG 299

Each student is responsible for requesting an official checkup of credits from the Registrar=s Office once he/she has earned a total of 54 semester hours.

NOTE: ALL STUDENTS APPLYING FOR ENTRANCE INTO THE TEP ARE GIVEN ONE CALENDAR YEAR FROM THE TIME OF THEIR FIRST ENTRANCE TESTING TO PASS THE PRAXIS I (PPST AND TO ACHIEVE A CUMULATIVE GPA OF 2.50 OR ABOVE.
ENTRANCE AND MAINTENANCE REQUIREMENTS FOR THE PROFESSIONAL SEMESTER (PS) AT MISSISSIPPI COLLEGE
STUDENT TEACHING ASSIGNMENTS ARE GENERALLY RESTRICTED TO COPIAH, HINDS, MADISON, RANKIN AND WARREN COUNTIES. Appeals to student teach outside these areas must be made to the Teacher Education Department Head. Student Teaching is to be completed during the senior year after the following requirements have been met:

- 1. Be admitted to the Teacher Education Program for at least one full semester prior to the semester of student
- Have completed EDU 299.
 Have passed the Writing Proficiency Exam
- 4. Have removed any grades of (I) incomplete
- Have completed any correspondence courses and have grade(s) on file in the Registrar's Office before the
- 6. Have at least a 2.75 GPA in the area(s) of expected certification as well as a cumulative GPA of 2.75. Have completed at least three-fourths of the required courses in his/her area of specialization, (secondary education students only).
- Have completed (with a minimum grade of C) all Professional Education courses except EDU 460, 431, 432, and 433 (secondary education student only).
 Upon taking EDU 458 or 460 - must pass with a grade of C or better
- 10. Successfully complete the 3 required assessments during the Methods of Science Teaching courses.

.In order to be recommended for licensure, a candidate must successful complete all assessments required of the science education program.

Applications for student teaching are screened by the Teacher Education Committee and students are notified of the Committee=s decision. Each student is responsible for returning the assigned forms properly completed to the licensure secretary by the assigned date.

Students pass the Praxis-CASE (see exception above) as part of the entrance requirements into the TEP. Students also pass Praxis II which includes the Principles of Learning and Teacher (PLT) and a specialty area test in order to be licensed by the MS **Department of Education.**

Mississippi College Department of Teacher Education and Leadership Student Teaching Scholarship

Freshmen who enter MC as an Education major and complete at least 7 semesters at MC (as an education major) are eligible to receive \$2500 during the student teaching semester.

Transfers who enter MC as an Education Major and complete at least 3 semesters at MC (as an education major) are eligible to receive \$1500 during the student teaching semester.

Students (teacher candidates) must meet all requirements for admission and maintenance into the Teacher Education Program, meet admission requirements for the Professional Semester, and successfully pass an external background check during their senior year in order to apply for the student teaching scholarship.

Students must declare an education major by the end of their first semester of attendance at Mississippi College. This scholarship would be in addition to any other scholarship given to students upon admission to MC.
