- The regular weekly meeting of the Mississippi College Student Senate was held Monday, February 22, 2016 at 9:15 p.m. Student Senate President St John presided over the meeting and Senate Clerk Waller was present. Invocation was given by Senator C. Stevens. Pledges were given by Senator B. Richardson. Senators E. Taylor, Terry, and M. Collins were absent and no senator was tardy. The minutes were approved as corrected. Motion to previous question was given by Senator Stringer.
- The Constitution Society was presented. Motion to skip debate and voice vote was given by Senator Stringer. The aye's had it and The Constitution Society was approved.
- Senate Resolution 2015-16-23, asking that the President of Executive Council be installed as a voting member on the President's Council, was presented by Senator Grissom. Motion to move the bill to emergency status and open the floor for debate was given by Senator C. Stevens. Senators Channell and Parish spoke in affirmation, and no Senator spoke in negation. By a roll call vote of 38-0-1, Senate Resolution 2015-16-23 passed.
- President McRae gave a report on behalf of the Documents and Protocol Committee, who motioned that the nomination of Homecoming Committee Chairperson be removed from the President of Executive Council's duties and given to the Office of Student Life.
