Your ministry as a CLC would likely include hanging out with men/women in your hall, getting involved with their residence hall activities, grabbing coffee or lunch, worshipping together, serving together and potentially leading a small group in the hall. Honestly, there is no "one-size-fits-all" for this ministry. Whatever the CLC is willing to give will directly connect to what he or she gets out of the experience.

Duties and Responsibilities

- Support the purpose, mission and goals of Mississippi College and the Department of Christian Development
- Serve students alongside the Office of Christian Development (campus ministries and local churches) and the residential staff, through being a personal example, encourager, and disciple maker
- Find and develop creative ways to connect with the residential staff and residents
- Be actively present in the assigned residence hall
- Attend regular gatherings that may include Christian Life Team meetings, residence hall staff meetings, individual meetings with the Director of Christian Life and Ministries, and others as needed
- Lead the residence hall to participate in at least one service project and two events a semester
- Assist the Department of Christian Development with campus wide initiatives
- Creatively promote events and programs for campus ministries and churches
- Fulfill other duties as assigned

Qualifications

- Enrolled as a full time student at Mississippi College
- Profess and demonstrate a Christian commitment and faith
- Be actively involved in a local church or campus ministry
- Maintain a minimum cumulative and semester GPA of 2.5 or higher
- Be in good judicial standings with the institution
